# Grandfathering established for current private solar customers

Our recently completed rate review includes changes for future private solar customers. Here's how customers may be affected by the changes approved by the Arizona Corporation Commission:



### If you are not a customer with private solar

The agreement **will reduce the subsidy** you are currently paying to support the private rooftop solar industry.



### If you have private solar or are in the process of installing it

You are **not affected**. You will keep the rules in place at the time of your agreement for 20 years from date of interconnection, and you can transfer that plan to a new homeowner if you move. As long as your completed solar application is received by **11:59 p.m. on August 31, 2017**, and your system is installed by **February 28, 2018**, you can be grandfathered to the current rules.



### If you are thinking about installing private solar in the future

You still **have the choice** to install private solar under a rate plan that:

- accurately reflects how you use energy and the grid,
- allows you to manage energy usage and bills, and
- provides certainty about key factors in your decision to go solar.
